Desired Finished Width:

Size to cut binding strips:

Sew binding on with a seam allowance of:

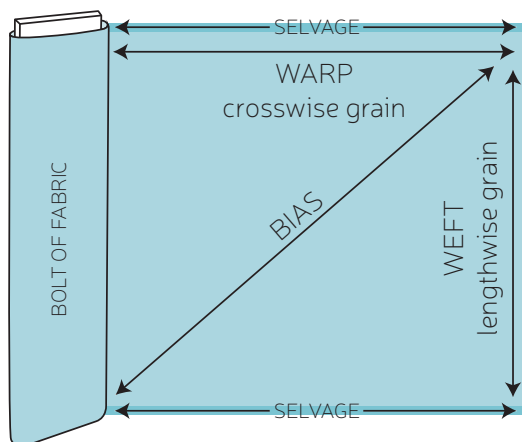
Desired Finished Width:	Single Fold	Double Fold	Sew binding on with a seam allowance of:
1/4"	1	2	Scant 1/4"
3/8"	1 1/2"	2 1/2"	Scant 3/8"
1/2"	2"	3"	Scant 1/2"
1"	4"	5"	Scant 1"

Standard Batting Sizes

45" x 60"	Crib
72" x 90"	Twin
81" x 96"	Full/Double
90" x 108"	Queen
120" x 120"	King

Suggested Quilt Sizes

Size	inches	centimeters
Baby	45" x 45"	114.3 x 114.3
Crib	45" x 60"	114.3 x 152.4
Throw	60" x 72"	152.4 x 182.9
Twin	67" x 99"	170.2 x 151.5
Double	82" x 96"	208.3 x 243.8
Queen	88" x 104"	223.5 x 264.2
King	106" x 108"	274.3 x 274.3



Straight grain binding: fold yardage selvage to selvage, then cut binding strips with the crosswise grain

Bias binding: fold yardage selvage to weft edge, then cut binding strips on the diagonal.
